

Notes:

1) Institutions impacted by the Hurricanes*:

Due to the effects of Hurricanes Katrina or Rita, the following institutions were either closed, relocated, or significantly curtailed their operations for the fall 2005 semester:

- Delgado Community College
- Louisiana Technical College - 5 campuses: Jefferson, Sidney Collier, Slidell, Sullivan, and West Jefferson
- Nunez Community College
- Southern University New Orleans
- SOWELA Technical Community College
- University of New Orleans

*Although impacted, since they were successful in reopening and offering a full fall term, LSU Health Sciences Center - New Orleans and McNeese State University were able to participate in the reporting requirements.

2) Fall 2005 reporting requirements:

These impacted institutions were excused from the following Board of Regents fall 2005 reporting requirements:

- Preliminary Enrollment Survey
- Student Credit Hour Reporting System
- Statewide Student Profile System
- Facilities Inventory and Utilization System

3) Caution to users of Regents' published reports:

Data from the impacted institutions will be excluded in the production reports developed from data reported in these reporting systems and published on the Board of Regents' website. Users of these reports are cautioned that totals reported at system, two-year or four-year, and state levels will not include these impacted institutions, and should, therefore, not be used to compare historical data at those same levels. Caution should also be used when comparing fall data reported by: 1) the two institutions impacted by the Hurricanes but able to report fall data - LSU Health Sciences Center - New Orleans and McNeese State University and 2) the non-impacted institutions that enrolled displaced students (approximately 10,000 statewide).

4) Long-range impacts of Fall 2005-06 reporting cycle:

The effects of the Hurricanes will have a multi-year impact on the ability of the Board of Regents to produce analysis and reports using data submitted for Fall 2005-06. Notices will be posted to subsequent published reports explaining how the data will be reported and cautioning users to be careful when comparing historical data.
